2020-2021 Extended Day Information

Contracts are required for each student that will be in extended day on a regular basis.

Contracts will be prorated for students that will be in extended day for less than 5 days per week but on a regular schedule. For example, a student needs extended day every Monday because of a piano lesson or every Tuesday and Wednesday.

Contracts will not be given for variable schedules, i.e., a student wants extended day for 2 days per week but one week it will be Monday and Tuesday and another week Wednesday and Thursday.

Students that are not on contract will be charged the drop-in rate of \$15.00 per day.

Students on a prorated schedule contract will be charged the drop-in rate of \$15.00 per day for days they are not on contract for.

Payment for a contract is required for the entire semester or the full year at the beginning of the semester.

No refunds will be given for days extended day is not used.

No discounts will be allowed for picking up students early.

If a student in grades K-5 is on contract to be picked up at 4:15 and is signed out later than 4:15 then a late fee of \$10.00 per day will be charged.

Any primer student signed out later than 3:20 or any older student signed out later than 5:30 will be charged an additional fee of \$1.00 per minute that will be paid to the teacher that had to stay late. Please be considerate of our teachers and pick up your students on time.

Students not picked up on time will be checked into extended day and charged the \$15.00 per day drop-in fee. This provides peace of mind for the parent and keeps our students safe.

NOTE: There is no extended day on Faculty Workshop days and the last day of the school year.
