

## Kirby Hall School 2023 – 2024 Tuition Schedule

\*After School Care fees can be paid monthly as part of FACTS Management (current families must sign up by April 30, 2023) or paid directly to Kirby Hall.

**Application Fee:** \$100 per applicant (non-refundable) due with the completed application. The application fee includes one entrance readiness assessment. If further outside testing or interviews are required, parents are responsible for paying those fees directly to the testing firm or interviewer.

**Enrollment Fee:** \$500 per *admitted* student (non-refundable) must be paid to secure your child's spot for the coming year. This is a part of the next year's tuition. For currently enrolled families the fee is \$500 per student; if received after February 1 the fee is \$700 of which \$500 is part of the next year's tuition. For new students offered admissions the \$500 enrollment is due within two (2) weeks of acceptance by Kirby Hall School unless stated otherwise.

**Facilities Usage Fee:** \$1,000 (non-refundable) is a one-time usage fee for any new student. Subsequent siblings will not be assessed an additional fee. Due by July 1 or \$200 late fee applied. Families accepted after July 1 will be given a specific date of when the facilities fee is due.
